From our Principal....

Kia ora Whanau. Ka nui te mihi ki a koutou - greetings to you all.

Welcome everyone to the start of Term 4. I trust that you have all had an enjoyable break and the children are refreshed and ready for the term ahead.

In the second to last week of Term 3 we farewelled Deana Averill at the Middle Syndicate **Open Assembly**. Many thanks to everyone who came along to farewell Deana and to the Home and School for providing the afternoon tea, both of which were much appreciated. Congratulations to the Middle Syndicate for the work that they put into the assembly together – well done.

At the end of last term each child will have brought home a pack for the **Fun Run**, which is being co-ordinated by our Home and School group. The Fun Run will be held at school on 4 November from 1.30pm and all families are welcome to attend.

There will be additional staffing arrangements that will need to be made and I will inform you of the relevant details in due course.

Many of them will have been at GPS throughout their time at primary school, while others have joined us over the years. It is important that both collectively and as individuals they strive to ensure their last term at GPS is a positive one. Our School Vision - Desire to Learn, Aspire to Achieve, is something that this group do particularly well and I congratulate them on this.
