## From our Principal....

Kia ora Whanau. Ka nui te mihi ki a koutou - greetings to you all.
Our 3 Way Conferences take place next Monday - 22 August from 8.15am to 5.45 pm . The bookings will close tomorrow at 3 pm , so please ensure that you have booked by then through www.schoolinterviews.co.nz and enter the code w8kc4. Further to previous notices, normal classes won't operate on this day and there will be no school bus service for GPS students. Children will come to school for their 3wc only. Goals set at the 3WC earlier in the year will be looked at and new ones set for the remainder of the year.

## Stop work Union meetings

We wish to advise our school community that the primary and secondary school unions have organised a series of stop work meetings across the country to discuss the proposed Ministry of Education funding model for schools. The meetings in our area will take place on Friday 9 September. All staff who are members of the union are entitled to attend one of two meetings.

These proposed changes, if implemented, will mean an increase in financial complexity for schools and Boards of Trustees, significant decisions around staffing levels and a likely increase in class sizes. The changes represent an erosion of funding to state schools, which are already under funded. The fact that both the primary and secondary sector unions are meeting together indicates the seriousness of this matter.

School will be open as usual on this day, but there will be reduced staffing levels to enable staff to attend a meeting. For each year group, there will be one teacher at school at any one time. In the junior syndicate, there will be two teachers at school.

While an alternative programme will be provided by staff throughout the day, parents are welcome to keep their child(ren) at home if they wish. Please let the office know on the day, or in the days leading up to Friday 9 September if your child(ren) will be away.

The staff are currently involved in Te Reo Maori lessons with Addie CouchSnow each Thursday this term after school. This is broadening our understanding of Te Reo, to in turn assist with programmes in classes. Many thanks to Addie for sharing her time and expertise with us.

There have been reports in the media recently about families taking holidays during term time. We have noticed a sharp increase in numbers this year compared with previous years. Please inform the school office or myself in writing if you are taking your child(ren) out of school during term time and the duration and reason for the absence.
