From our Principal....

A lot of training has taken place over the last few weeks in the lead up to our **school and district cross country** events. It was pleasing to see the effort that everyone put into their respective races in the Domain for the school event and at Peel Forest Station for those who were selected for the district cross country. Well done everyone!

We had five nominations for parent-elected representatives on the **Board of Trustees**, so no election was required. We welcome new Board members Frances Coles, Juliet Marsden and Justin O'Brien, along with returning members Joe Wyborn and Rob Wilson. Jo Drake continues as the staff representative.

I would like to acknowledge Glen Smith, John Hayhoe and Ingrid Hanrahan who did not restand for the Board. I wish them all the best for their future endeavours. On behalf of the GPS community I thank the previous Board members for the time they have committed to the school over the last three years and for the strong and effective governance that they have provided.

We have recently evaluated the procedures we will follow should we need to enact an **emergency closure** once the school day has started. Closure could be due to natural events such as snow, high winds or flooding. There are a number of steps that we will work through to ensure children and staff are able to get home safely. Our initial focus will be to contact the parents of all bus children to advise that the buses will be coming home early and

for these parents to confirm their child's travel arrangements with school staff. Bus children will not be sent home on the bus if parents cannot be contacted on the primary cell phone or landline number provided to the school office. We ask that parents refrain from phoning the school so that phone lines can be kept clear for these outgoing calls.

If emergency closure is enacted, bus children will meet and be checked off in the hall, while non bus children will be supervised in various classes:

Please note that rooms in brackets will be used when the junior block rebuild is occurring. Bus children who have alternative travel arrangements made for them can either be collected by a parent or caregiver from the hall (before buses depart) or from the office (once buses have departed).

Once parents of bus children have been contacted, we will post updates on our school Facebook page and on our website via Twitter. Children who are not on buses can be collected from the above classes before the end of the school day.

If the school is closed before the start of the school day, the system is more straight-forward. Once the decision is made not to open, or to delay opening, information will be posted on Facebook, the school website and on Port FM and Hokonui Mid Canterbury. We work in with Geraldine High School, whom we share buses with as well as many family connections.

Safety on the **school crossing** is an ongoing and important issue, with driver behaviour being a concern on a regular basis. This typically involves speed and failure to stop upon request by the adult on duty. While driving 50km per hour past a school as children arrive and leave is legal, many people,

including myself would deem that such a speed is excessive at either end of the school day. As such, I ask that we all lower our speeds around the school in order to keep crossing users safe. I have raised this point in writing with the NZ Transport Agency, Timaru District Council and the Police and hopefully in an upcoming addition of the Geraldine News.

I have also requested the installation of a Kea Crossing whereby trained senior students under the supervision of an adult hold a sign, which is swung out onto the road to stop traffic and allow people to cross safely. The training for students and supervisors would be provided by the Police. I will keep you all informed as this develops.

As mentioned in earlier newsletters, on **Friday 3rd June school will be closed** for a day of staff development. We will also be **closed on Monday 6 June for Queen's Birthday.**
