From our Principal....

I trust all GPS families have had an enjoyable Easter break. 2016 is one of the rare years when Easter fell outside of the term holidays. When this occurs, Easter Tuesday is classed as a school holiday. There are now just two and a half busy weeks until the end of the term.

The **newsletter** is put onto our website each time it is published. On the newsletter page, there is also a login area. You don't need to log in to view the newsletter – it can be accessed by clicking on the individual dates. The log in function is for school staff only to edit the site.

This term there are two **school policies** which are being reviewed – school swimming pool and alcohol, drugs and other harmful substances. These can be accessed through our School Docs site. The instructions for reviewing policies through School Docs are available on our website under the School Info tab.

The triennial **Board of Trustees election** process takes place in the first half of next term. In the first week of Term 2 we will be calling for nominations. The three-week period for nominations will close on 20 May. Parent Trustees are elected by their fellow parents. Elected Trustees can also be members of the local community who don't have children at GPS. While they will bring a range of skills from their lives as parents and in their line of work, worthwhile and concise training is provided through the NZ School Trustees Association. There are likely to be three existing members of the

Board who won't be re-standing. If you have any queries about being on the BOT, please see myself or any Board member. Nominations will open on Monday 2 May (first day of Term 2) and nomination forms will be available from the school office on this date. The next Board of Trustees meeting is on Tuesday 12 April at 5pm and is open to members of the public.

Monday 11 April, 7pm, School Staff Room GERALDINE SCHOOLS TRANSPORT NETWORK

We have noticed an increase in requests from parents of children who are not eligible to access bus transport, wanting to use the bus service on an occasional basis for after school care/social arrangements.

We have sought clarification from the Geraldine Schools Transport Network who advise the following:

- Only registered bus students who normally use the bus are able to change their normal bus arrangements by filling in a yellow bus pass. These are issued on a case by case basis and as space permits, but will not be approved for changes for sporting arrangements, play dates, birthday parties or sleepovers.
- The yellow bus passes for <u>eligible</u> bus students must be handed to the school office at least 24 hours prior to the bus departure.
- Bus drivers are instructed to drop off and pick up students at the designated point, unless a yellow bus form has been completed and approved within the above timeframe.
- Children who are not eligible for bus transportation will only be permitted access on a bus on a case by case basis and this will typically be in the event of an emergency or extenuating family circumstances. Events such as changes for sporting arrangements, play dates, birthday parties or sleepovers are excluded from the above circumstances.

For safety reasons we request that parents do not remove their children from buses at the High School. A roll check is done at the Geraldine Primary School Prior to Departure for the High School. A second roll check is completed at the High School once the primary children have transferred onto their home buses. Safety is paramount.

Reminder Emergency Bus Evacuation starts with the Police Educators at Geraldine High School. Please be aware that buses may run a few minutes late. The timetable is as follows:
