#### From our Principal....

Term 3 has started positively, and it is good to see all the children back at school after their break. I trust that this time has been an enjoyable one for GPS families and you are all looking forward to the term that lies ahead.

With snow falls possibly on the way in the next 24 hours, it is timely to remind our families about the procedures we will follow should we need to enact an **emergency closure once the school day has started.** Closure could be due to natural events such as snow, high winds or flooding. There are a number of steps that we will work through to ensure children and staff are able to get home safely.

Our initial focus will be to contact the parents of all bus children to advise that the buses will be coming home early and for these parents to confirm their child's travel arrangements with school staff. Bus children will not be sent home on the bus if parents cannot be contacted on the primary cell phone or landline number provided to the school office. We ask that parents refrain from phoning the school so that phone lines can be kept clear for these outgoing calls.

If emergency closure is enacted, bus children will meet and be checked off in the hall, while non bus children will be supervised in various classes:

Please note that rooms in brackets are used as the junior block rebuild is occurring. Bus children who have alternative travel arrangements made for them can either be collected by a parent or caregiver from the hall (before buses depart) or from the office (once buses have departed).

Once parents of bus children have been contacted, we will post updates on our school Facebook page and on our website via Twitter. Children who are not on buses can be collected from the above classes before the end of the school day.

If the school is closed before the start of the school day, the system is more straight-forward. Once the decision is made not to open, or to delay opening, information will be posted on Facebook, the school website and on Port FM and Hokonui Mid Canterbury. We work in with Geraldine High School, whom we share buses with as well as many family connections. It is important that we have up to date contact details for each family. If yours have changed, please contact the school office.

#### Activity Fees

A kind reminder to pay Activity Fees if these have not been done already -\$80 per year per child, or \$20 per term for those starting at GPS during the year. Broken down further, this amounts to \$2 a week or 40 cents a day! We ask that these are paid over the holidays to our school bank account 01-0841-0024832-10. A regular payment option can also be established. Please note that Activity Fees are a cost recovery for expenses related to your child's learning across the school year. We do not charge a voluntary School Donation.

Parking on yellow lines
