From our Principal....

Kia ora Whanau. Ka nui te mihi ki a koutou - greetings to you all.

This is the final newsletter for the school year. It has been rewarding to see the work that the staff, students and school community do together to make our school the great place that it is. A school's positive culture doesn't occur by accident. Rather, it is the way that we all work together for the betterment of each other. This happens in many forms for adults and students alike and I commend everyone who has contributed in some way to make our school 'culture' happen over the past year.

Our **Final Assembly** will be held next Wednesday, 14 December at 1pm. This is the last time that we will come together as a school to farewell our Year 6 students.
