From our Principal....

I trust all GPS families had an enjoyable **long weekend**, which included our Teacher Only Day last Friday. On this day, the staff were working with a Maths facilitator, as well as looking at student competencies in Digital Technology across the year groups.

We are making some progress with **our junior block upgrade**. Key parts of this upgrade were shared in a newsletter on 12 May. The tender period is now closed and we are close to selecting a contractor to work with. Once this has been achieved, we will have a better idea as to when we can expect the project to commence.

We are in the process of installing **widescreen 50**" **TVs** in classrooms with aging data projectors. The first ones went in late last week and this work will continue over the next week or two. The children won't spend all their days watching TV! They will be used for a range of activities, including the sharing of work, viewing relevant websites, viewing class brainstorms, – essentially what the data projectors were used for.

Now that winter is here and the cold is starting to bite, I refer parents back to our last newsletter (26 May) regarding **emergency closure procedures**. A copy of this newsletter is on our website. Please familiarise yourself with these procedures.

A Board of Trustees and staff sub committee have worked through the feedback that was gathered from our parent and staff surveys about a

future **School Vision**. There were many wonderful ideas and words to describe GPS that resonated with those who took part. Bringing these together to capture our school, both now and in the future was the focus of the sub committee. A draft Vision will be shared with the staff and full Board over the next week, prior to sharing with our community.
