From our Principal....

The Home and School group held their AGM on Monday night. On behalf of the school community, many thanks to you all for the time and service you have given to GPS. Your dedication and input has been appreciated by us all.

Last week our Year 6 students ventured out to Lindisfarne for their annual camp. Mr Davidson, Whaea Ange and Mrs Waldron were ably supported by close to 20 parents throughout the week - help that was much appreciated. It was rewarding to see so many families travel out to attend the BBQ and concert on Thursday night. It was also good to see some of GPS's past students and younger siblings at camp – no doubt reliving many happy memories of past camps as well as expectations of camps to come. Well done to everyone involved.

Our survey of Religious Education (RE) / Bible in Schools closed last Friday. Thank you to everyone who took the time to complete the online survey. Due to the results of this survey, Religious Education will now be taking place during lunch time in Terms 2 and 3, day to be confirmed. This decision has been ratified by the Board of Trustees.

Parents who wish their children to be involved in RE will therefore be able to access this at lunchtimes. There is an **opt in** return form later in this

newsletter, which is due back to the school office by Wednesday 23 March. If you wish your child to take part in lunchtime RE, please return the form to school by this time. RE classes will be based on this information and numbers passed to the co-ordinators so that materials can be organised.

The Board of Trustee election process takes place in the first half of next term. We will be calling for nominations in the first week of next term and nominations will close on Friday 20th May. Board members are elected by our parents to represent their views and to provide overall governance and stewardship to the school. They aren't involved in the day to day running of the school – this lies with myself as Principal and the staff.

The Board, which includes the Principal and Staff Rep, sets the direction for the school. Among other tasks, they should positively represent the school, and act as good employers. Board members bring a variety of skills and come from a range of backgrounds. Being a Board member isn't an arduous task. Meetings are typically held ten times a year on a monthly basis. Occasionally there will be training and planning sessions. Being a Board member gives you a special insight into the school. Much of the learning is done on the job.

School Docs is an online portal that houses all our school policies and procedures.

If you are asked for a user name, enter **gps**

If you are asked for a password, enter **geraldine**

This will take you to our School Docs home page.

In the search bar (top left), type in the name of the policy to be reviewed and click search.

With the policies that now come up, click on the policy you wish to review. There are often additional procedures which can be read alongside the policy.

Read through the policy and to comment, go to the **Red Policy Review** button (top right)

Click the parent / caregiver option and type in your name if you wish. Click the **Login** button. A new window will appear – you can now review this policy. You will be asked to rate the <u>content</u> and <u>implementation</u> of this policy. You can provide a comment if you wish. Click **Submit** when you're done.

This is how our policies are reviewed by parents / caregivers, staff and Board of Trustees members. Please feel free to look at any other policies. All policies are reviewed over a 3-year cycle.

GERALDINE SCHOOLS TRANSPORT NETWORK

We have noticed an increase in requests from parents of children who are not eligible to access bus transport, wanting to use the bus service on an occasional basis for after school care/social arrangements.

We have sought clarification from the Geraldine Schools Transport Network who advise the following:

- Only registered bus students who normally use the bus are able to change their normal bus arrangements by filling in a yellow bus pass. These are issued on a case by case basis and as space permits, but will not be approved for changes for sporting arrangements, play dates, birthday parties or sleepovers.
- The yellow bus passes for <u>eligible</u> bus students must be handed to the school office at least 24 hours prior to the bus departure.
- Bus drivers are instructed to drop off and pick up students at the designated point, unless a yellow bus form has been completed and approved within the above timeframe.
- Children who are not eligible for bus transportation will only be permitted access on a bus on a case by case basis and this will typically be in the event of an emergency or extenuating family circumstances. Events such as changes for sporting arrangements, play dates, birthday parties or sleepovers are excluded from the above circumstances.

For safety reasons we request that parents do not remove their children from buses at the High School. A roll check is done at the Geraldine Primary School Prior to Departure for the High School. A second roll check is completed at the High School once the primary children have transferred onto their home buses. Safety is paramount.

Reminder Emergency Bus Evacuation starts with the Police Educators at Geraldine High School. Please be aware that Buses may run a few minutes late. The timetable is as follows:
