From our Principal....

Welcome back to the start of Term 2. I trust that all families have had an enjoyable break. The last two days of the holidays saw a large contingent of the teaching staff and myself attend the **Energise Conference** for teachers and school leaders in Ashburton. We attended workshops focused on writing, maths, digital learning and leadership. Our two international keynote speakers Kevin Honeycutt (USA) and Khao Do (Vietnam/Australia) shared their stories and provided much inspiration for those in attendance.

Earlier this week I wrote to parents of students in Rooms 6, 7, 8 and 9 about the **redevelopment of the junior block**. Key aspects that are planned for this upgrade in the junior block include:

- New / repainted display spaces
- Sliding doors between each room, allowing for better interclass access when required
- New and extended bench areas
- Teacher storage units
- Heat pumps to replace existing heating provisions
- New external access sliding doors
- Widescreen 50" TVs (these will be also be placed in all classrooms that are currently used)

As well as the upgrade to the classrooms, we also plan to address the junior toilet block. This will be remodelled throughout to include:

- Breakout / work / resource spaces where the boys' toilets are currently located
- New boys' and girls' toilet areas where the girls' toilets are currently located

 Covered accessway / bag storage between the girls' toilet and Room 7

This upgrade is currently at the tendering stage. Once a preferred construction company has been selected and a start date confirmed, we will need to rehouse each of the four junior classes during the building phase. Classes will be temporarily housed as follows:

- Room 6 and 9 will move to Rooms 15 and 16
- Room 7 and 8 will move to the Library
- Room 15 will move to the Meeting Room inside the administration area. Please note that access to the Meeting Room for Room 15 students / parents will be through the door leading from the lunch area, not the main office or staffroom door by Room 1.

All junior classes will use the Room 3 toilets during the building phase. Room 3 will use the Room 4 and 5 toilets. While junior students will do their learning in different spaces during construction, classroom programmes will continue as normal. While a start date for construction is yet to be confirmed it will hopefully be around the middle of the term. Movement into temporary classes will take place around a week before construction commences.

While there will be some changes and inconvenience during the construction period, this is an exciting time for our school and once the project is completed, the junior classes will have some fresh newly remodelled areas in which to work and learn.

Some members of our school community will soon be moving into the **dairy changeover** period. If you expect to be leaving GPS, or know of any new arrivals, please contact the school office as soon as possible, or encourage those who intend to join our school to do so at their earliest convenience.

Please note that we have an enrolment zone in place, which we adhere to in order to manage student numbers. If the dairy changeover, or other change in circumstance sees a current GPS family move out of our enrolment zone, they will still be entitled to attend GPS, but bus entitlement may be affected depending on where they live. Please contact our school office for clarification on this matter.

Geraldine Primary now has a **Facebook** page. This will run alongside our established Twitter page (@geraldineps1) as a way of sharing information with our community. We also share information in regular newsletters, which come fortnightly. Newsletters are posted on our web page – www.geraldineprimary.school.nz . We will aim to post a link to the newsletter on Facebook and Twitter as well.

We are now into the nomination period for the **Board of Trustees election**. Nomination forms can be collected from the school office. The nomination period closes on Friday 20 May at noon – all forms must be in by this time. If you would like to know more about the workings of the Board, please feel free to contact any Board member or myself.

Many thanks to everyone who attended the John Parsons cyber safety evening on Monday. John provided some thought-provoking discussion which I'm sure parents will find useful in order to keep their children safe when using digital devices.
