From our Principal....

The first term of the year is over and as you read this, your children will no doubt be looking forward to the two-week break that lies ahead. While this term has been slightly longer than most, it has certainly flown by with a number of various events taking place.

Many thanks to the staff and parents who have planned, assisted and attended activities such as class trips, camps, sport events, swimming and fundraisers. There have been many people within our school community who have worked together to ensure that the children at GPS receive a varied and interesting education. A big thank you!

Our **Breakfast BBQ** last Friday was again successful, with \$1,774.20 being raised. Congratulations to our Year 5 and 6 students for the running of their stalls and the combined efforts of all involved. Thank you to our Home and School for their assistance with tea and coffee and uniform stalls, Fresh Choice for the supply of sausages and bread and the Geraldine Lions for the provision of a BBQ trailer and cooking of the sausages. Many thanks to those who took the time to complete our recent **PB4L survey**. We had 44 replies, which is about 20% of our families. We have received lots of valuable feedback, which we will share with you in early Term 2.

The first day of next term will see the start of our **Road Patrol**. This will involve Year 6 students, under the guidance of a parent or teacher, managing the pedestrian crossing on Cox Street. The Road Patrol team received training from Chris Wiltshire, our Police Education Officer on Monday and some of them did a trial run this week.

I ask that students and parents show due patience and consideration for the Road Patrol team, especially when they are learning the ropes in the first part of Term 2. Having the patrol will signify a change in the way the crossing is managed at either end of the school day.

As outlined in an earlier newsletter this term, some staff will be on leave or departing GPS today. I wish **Sarah McCone** (Room 12) all the best for her travels overseas in Term 2. We all look forward to her return in Term 3. **Rosie Ulrich** (Room 2) is moving up to the Bay of Plenty and we wish her well for the exciting times that lie ahead in her new school. I thank Rosie for her professionalism and being the role model that she has been for our students, particularly those in Room 2.

Room 15, our second New Entrant class, will commence in week 5 of Term 2. **Glynis Sullivan and Ruth Gardiner** will be teaching in this class. Glynis will teach Monday – Wednesday, with Ruth teaching Thursday and Friday.

I will also be away in Term 2, on a Ministry of Education sabbatical. As mentioned previously, Murray Davidson will be Acting Principal next term. School notices:

District Cross Country

After discussion with other local schools, this event involving GPS, Woodbury and Carew Peel Forest won't be continuing in 2017. As the schools' rolls have increased over time, this event has become more complex to organize and as such, GPS runners won't be attending as it is now a Woodbury and Carew cross country. We will still have our own event, from which runners will qualify for selection to the South Canterbury Cross Country. Dates for our own event have been confirmed for Term 2 and are listed in the Calendar section of this newsletter.

Bus access

If families move house and they have been able to access bus transport prior to their move, ongoing access to the bus service may not necessarily continue, depending on where they have moved to. All schools have a Transport Entitlement Zone (TEZ), which allows students living within the TEZ to access buses, if they live a certain distance from school. If a move takes them outside the TEZ, they will need to get to the TEZ boundary or pick up point and meet the bus there. Bronwyn Hawkins the school bus controller will need to be contacted to discuss any changes and a possible new pick up point. Activity Fees

Invoices have recently been sent out and we appreciate the subsequent payments received. The Activity Fee for 2017 has been

set at \$80 per student. If the Activity Fee has been paid before the end of the holidays, or if an automatic payment is established that enables it to be paid in full before the end of the school year, this fee is reduced to \$70. From term 2, the Activity Fee reverts to \$80, or \$20 per term enrolled for those starting at GPS during the year.

Home Alone Law

As we head into the April holidays, it is timely to remind parents about this legislation and that they consider the provision of care for their children under the age of 14 years at all times.

Staying Safe Online

It is important that parents are aware about what their children are viewing and having access to in an online environment. This involves ensuring that children are safe when on digital devices. Netsafe - www.netsafe.org.nz provides some valuable information for parents in this regard.


Te kupu o te wiki, the word of the week
