From our Principal....

Kia ora Whanau. Ka nui te mihi ki a koutou - greetings to you all.

Last Friday we held our **3 Way Conferences**. We had a turnout of around 85%, with some families scheduled for catch ups after the actual day. Many thanks to everyone who attended the 3WCs and for having input into discussions about their child's learning and goal setting. Goal setting sheets are due to come home soon, so you will be able to continue to assist your child at home with their goals.

Throughout the term we have mentioned the transition to **sharing our newsletters via email**. This will commence in Term 2. We were able to confirm a lot of emails at the 3WCs. If we haven't got your email at this stage, please email the office – office@geraldine.school.nz so that we get accurate details. Some paper copies of the newsletter will still be available from the office and also digitally on the school website.

Last week a flyer was sent home about **staffing appointments and movements**, both currently and for Term 2. This affects six classes to varying degrees. Exact details of these changes can be found in the 23 March newsletter on our website.

In early March schools are require to submit **student achievement data** from the previous year to the Ministry of Education (MOE). Our 2016 data is currently with the MOE and will be publically available on the <u>www.educationcounts.govt.nz</u> website in May.

In both Reading and Writing, 77% of our students achieved at or above the national standard for their year group in 2016. In Maths, 75% of our students achieved the national standard. We are always looking to build on our results from the previous year. We also recognise that children achieve in many different ways and we value what they can do in all areas of learning.

Finally, our annual Breakfast BBQ will be held next Friday, **from 8 – 9 am.** This is run by our Year 5 and 6 students and helps to raise money for our sponsored child from Myanmar. There will be a variety of stalls to support and games to be involved in. Parents are most welcome to attend this event.

We are excited to introduce to you Te kupu o te wiki, the word of the week


