From our Principal....

On Tuesday I had the pleasure of joining Tangaroa syndicate (Year 5 and 6) at Mt Hutt for a day of **skiing and snowboarding**. It was obvious that everyone involved had lots of fun on the mountain. Congratulations to the staff for a well-organised trip and thank you to all the parents that attended to support the students. Visits into the outdoors do require significant planning from the staff to ensure they run smoothly and would not be able to occur without parental support. Well done to everyone involved.

Two Fridays ago our **kapa haka group** performed at the annual Flava Festival. This was another group of students that has benefitted from significant support from whanau. A big congratulations to the group for an amazing performance on stage and also to their tutors Whaea Bianca, Whaea Jordyn and Whaea Ange for the hours they have put in over the past one and a half terms to prepare the group for the festival. I ask that parents discuss **safe walking to and from school** with their children. I have received recent reports from concerned members of the community regarding our students taking risks when crossing the road. While Cox Street is particularly busy, we have made it somewhat safer by improvements to the pedestrian crossing. This is the best place to cross if the other side of Cox Street needs to be accessed. If other roads need to be crossed to and from school, students are reminded to take care while doing so.

Tomorrow (Friday) the junior syndicate are having a **transition to school morning** from 9.15 – 10.40 am for students who will be starting at GPS either this term or in term 4. If you have a child who is turning five in the next four months, or know of someone who this applies to, you / they are most welcome to attend this morning with your child.

Office Payments

In line with our new accounting system, we have now installed a locked blue dropbox in the office entry. While our preferred method of payment is by direct banking, parents who wish to pay cash or cheque can use this box to deposit payments.

Payments must be in an envelope clearly labelled with your child's name, room number and the purpose of the payment. Cash must be the correct amount as no change is able to be given. The dropbox will be cleared daily, and payments will be recorded in our online system. Receipts will be issued on request.

Reading folders and bus vests will still be sold from the school office and payment for this needs to be given direct to the office ladies. Please be aware that we do not have eftpos facilities and the correct payment amount would be much appreciated as the office does not carry change.

Please use your child's name as a reference and what the payment is for e.g. Activity Fee, Camp etc.


Mauri ora whānau,

Geraldine Primary Community Stock Scheme 2017

While we are all trying to keep dry and warm this winter, spring is not far away and once again we are asking our local farming community to support our school by rearing calves and lambs for our annual stock scheme. This fundraiser is one of the main cash earners for our school where 100% of the earnings are donated back to our school.

For those families new to the scheme, a heifer or bull calf, either dairy or beef, is selected early in the calving season, tagged with a tag provided by the Home and School, reared on farm alongside other stock and then collected early December for auction at the Temuka Sale Yards. All calves are weighed individually before sale. Lambs can be similarly donated for sale at weaning with all proceeds going to GPS.

Thank you to the families who have donated in the past. Your generosity is very much appreciated. The funds raised have been used to further our teaching resources available to our children, eg: upgrading the playground; purchasing robotic kits and computers for class use; upgrading the library furniture and improving the junior block to mention just a few.
