From our Principal....

Kia ora Whanau. Ka nui te mihi ki a koutou - greetings to you all.

Last week saw the finish of our work with **ARA polytechnic** for the year, with Rooms 4 and 5 rock climbing and abseiling. We have been very fortunate to have the skills of the ARA students to organise and teach our Year 5 and 6 children over the last few weeks. Activities have also included kayaking, orienteering, bush walking, shelter building and other team building activities.

This Friday we are having a **Social Worker mufti day**. This day is important for us in order to help fund us having our own Social Worker at school. This is a unique and valuable service for our children and families and we appreciate your generosity.

We expect a high standard of behaviour from all our students both in the classroom and the playground. Our school is part of the PB4L (Positive Behaviour for Learning) programme. Children are encouraged with praise and 'gotchas' for positive behaviour. Throughout our school we have a **Classroom procedure** to help manage classroom behaviour.

For undesirable behaviour the following steps will apply in the classrooms.

- 1. Verbal correction / redirection
- 2. Warning (write name in book)
- 3. Time out for 5 10 minutes
- 4. Pink Slip transfer to alternative class (possibly teacher to contact home)
- 5. Refer to Deputy Principal or Principal, contact home.

Office Payments

In line with our new accounting system, we have now installed a locked blue dropbox in the office entry. While our preferred method of payment is by direct banking, parents who wish to pay cash or cheque can use this box to deposit payments.

Payments must be in an envelope clearly labelled with your child's name, room number and the purpose of the payment. Cash must be the correct amount as no change is able to be given. The dropbox will be cleared daily, and payments will be recorded in our online system. Receipts will be issued on request.

Reading folders and bus vests will still be sold from the school office and payment for this needs to be given direct to the office ladies. Please be aware that we do not have eftpos facilities and the correct payment amount would be much appreciated as the office does not carry change.


Te kupu o te wiki, the word of the week
