# From our Principal....

Kia ora Whanau. Ka nui te mihi ki a koutou - greetings to you all.

We had a large number of people attending our **Parent Information Sessions and Family BBQ** last Wednesday. The format of the Information Sessions varied from past years in the middle and senior schools, who adopted a slightly different approach, encouraging parents to pop in between 5 and 5.30pm before the BBQ. By having the two events on the same night we hoped that this would encourage higher attendance by asking parents in to school on one night rather than two.

The staff have evaluated this approach at a recent meeting. If parents have any comments about having the two events on the one night, or comments about the evening in general, please feel free to email me – principal@geraldine.school.nz.

The start of the year presents a good opportunity to mention our **Complaints and Concerns Procedures**. Generally if a concern has arisen, parents are best to speak to their child's classroom teacher if it is an in class matter. This could involve their child's learning, homework or social relationships. For more of a schoolwide issue, please see a member of the management team or myself. If

matters are brought to the attention of the correct person sooner rather than later, a better outcome is easier to reach.

Our school website has a link to our **School Docs policy portal**, where details of all policies and procedures are clearly stated. Click on the School Information tab on our website and go to the School Policies section.

High levels of **student attendance** is one contributing factor to overall progress and success at school. An attendance rate of at least 90% will increase the chances of this success. Where attendance levels drop below 90%, gaps in learning will inevitably start to appear – missed group reading lessons, or key elements of topic work for example.

Most of the students at GPS are supported to have high levels of attendance. The 90% rate allows for some sickness, or other justified reasons for absence. A rate of 80% represents one day off a week, ten days a term or approximately 40 school days a year. If this level is sustained, the likelihood of underachievement increases.

Closely aligned to attendance is punctuality, which I will discuss in the next newsletter.

In last week's newsletter we mentioned that from Term 2 we are aiming to share the newsletter with our school community via email, as well as on the school website. In order to be able to have the fortnightly newsletter emailed, please provide your email address to the office: office@geraldine.school.nz . We would appreciate this contact being through email in order to get accurate email details.

We will continue to mention this throughout the term in order to have a smooth transition to this new system in Term 2. If you don't have an email address, you or your child will be able to collect a paper copy through the office throughout Term 2. We will continue to let parents who are signed up to our Twitter and Facebook posts know when a newsletter is available on the website. Last week parents of Room 2 students were made aware of the **resignation of Rosie Ulrich**, effective as of the end of this term. Rosie and her partner Chris will be moving to the Eastern Bay of Plenty where Chris has been awarded a position on a dairy farm. Rosie has been appointed to a teaching position at Otamarakau School, which is 20 minutes east of Te Puke.

We will be sorry to lose a teacher of Rosie's calibre on our staff. We thank her for her contributions over the past year, both as a teacher in Room 2 and for her co-ordination of PE and Physical Activity Leaders. We wish both her and Chris all the very best in their new ventures in the North Island. They have exciting and busy times ahead of them!

The appointment process for a new teacher in Room 2 for terms 2 – 4 has commenced and I will inform you all when we have made an appointment.
