#### From our Principal....

We are about to survey parents regarding **Health Education** programmes for 2018-2019. This was last done in 2015 and the Ministry of Education requires schools to consult parents every two years about Health Education. Later in this newsletter we have included details of the draft school statement and an outline of the proposed programme. The two documents should be read prior to completing the survey.

Over the past two terms we have been **reviewing our Education Outside the Classroom (EOTC)**, **programmes**, **policies and procedures**. Part of the review process included surveying a sample of parents, staff, and Year 4 - 6 students. Thank you very much for your responses and feedback. Overall, the responses were positive and affirming. This has identified what EOTC experiences are offered at GPS, what we do well and what we can improve on. We have made some refinements to our documentation and expectations following on from this review.

EOTC is curriculum-based teaching and learning that goes beyond the walls of the classroom. Experiences outside the classroom reinforce learning and add value to children's education. Examples of this are varied and include: visits to the local domain, fire station, museum, camp, ski trip, Kiwisport coaching and music festival. We will continue to refine and look for EOTC opportunities that are relevant to our school and syndicate programmes to benefit student learning.

We are in the process of designing some **bilingual signage**, which will be seen in key areas around the school. While we know where and what the swimming pool is, did you know that the translation into Te Reo is *Wahi Kaukau*? Or that school office translates to *Te Tari Kura*?

We are also considering displaying our school mihi at the Wilson Street entrance. Your child may be able to recite their mihi and for many of them, this in part, will be the same as the school one:

#### Tēna Kōutou Katoa Kō Tarahāoa te ma<u>u</u>ka Kō Waihi te awa Kō Arai-te-uru te waka Kō Arowhenua te marae Kō te kura tuatahi o Raukapuka

We hope that signs such as these will appear around the school in the not-too-distant future – look out for them!

Later in this newsletter there is a flyer for our **New Entrant Information Afternoon**, which will be held on Wednesday 22<sup>nd</sup> November at 1.30pm. We encourage any families who have children turning 5 between December 2017 and June 2018, to come along to this afternoon to learn about starting school at Geraldine Primary.

#### Geraldine Primary School Health Programme 2018 - 2019

#### DRAFT SCHOOL STATEMENT

Schools are required to consult with the school community about the content of the Health Education components of the curriculum. Prior to this consultation, the school will prepare a draft statement and programme about the delivery of the health curriculum, then share it with the community. Schools and their communities are required to consider the learning needs of their students in regards to their well-being.

Once accepted, the school will then adopt the statement and programme. While schools are not required to obtain parental permission for each programme once it has been approved by the Board of Trustees, parents are permitted to apply to the Principal in writing to have their child excluded from specified parts of the Health programme relating to sexuality education / Positive Puberty.

#### Rationale:

Through the delivery of the Health programme, we aim to enhance the Hauora / well being of our students.

Hauora involves the physical, social, mental and emotional development of the children. We aim to assist every child to develop a positive attitude and to take increasing responsibility for themselves. This can be enhanced by a healthy and safe learning environment that encourages students to make a positive contribution to their own well being, the well-being of others and the wider community. **Purposes:** 

# 1. To enable all students to develop positive attitudes and take responsibility for hygiene, nutritional and growth needs.

- 2. To encourage positive relationships for all students and staff that are based on respect for others, acceptance of differences, and to develop interpersonal skills to enhance this.
- 3. To prepare students to contribute to the health and safety of their environment by identifying and using safe practices, cooperating with others and recognising the support people and resources that enhance community well being.

#### Guidelines:

- 1. Provide regular, varied, progressive and safe learning experiences where positive attitudes to Health are encouraged.
- 2. Develop programmes which meet the specific needs of the children.
- 3. Present programmes in a way that encourages children to set their own goals and start to develop their independence and self responsibility.
- 4. Provide opportunities for children to work cooperatively.
- 5. Involve resource people from within the school and the wider community to enrich and extend the programmes.
- 6. Where appropriate, an interactive partnership between the school and home will be established and maintained to involve and keep parents/the community informed of activities and expectations.
- 7. We recognise that PB4L is an integral part of the GPS curriculum and is woven through our programmes.

8. As a school we are also aware of the importance of Mental Health and Wellbeing. We will investigate suitable programmes that can support our students in this area.

Whilst we will take these factors into consideration, we are unable to guarantee each request. Please note that this is not an opportunity to request a particular teacher or being placed with particular friends. If you know that your child is not going to be attending GPS in 2018 (other than Year 6's), please let me know in writing as soon as possible.
