**New Entrant Information Afternoon**, Wednesday 22<sup>nd</sup> November at 1.30pm. We encourage any families who have children turning 5 between December 2017 and June 2018, to come along to this afternoon to learn about starting school at Geraldine Primary.

## 2018 Classes

We are beginning the **process of forming classes for 2018**. If you have a 5 year old New Entrant child who will start with us next year, or know of someone who this applies to, it is important that the office is informed as soon as possible and an enrolment form completed, if this hasn't been done already. This also applies to children in other year groups who will be attending GPS from 2018. Having an accurate understanding about new enrolments is important as it assists with the composition of classes.

As part of the class formation process, if parents have any factors that they would like senior staff to consider regarding their child(ren), please put these in writing to Andrew Leverton, by way of a letter or email – principal@geraldine.school.nz as soon as possible or by **Friday 17 November** at the latest. Whilst we will take these factors into consideration, we are unable to guarantee each request. Please note that this is not an opportunity to request a particular teacher or being placed with particular friends. If you know that your child is not going to be attending GPS in 2018 (other than Year 6's), please let me know in writing as soon as possible.

## Lost Library books

Thank you to everyone who has paid to replace lost books from the Library.

If you still have overdue books, please keep looking for them so they can be returned. At present there are 163 books **overdue** with an average replacement cost of \$15 which means there is \$2,445 worth of books that haven't been returned by their due date for a variety of reasons.

There has been a big increase in severely damaged and lost books this year which impacts on what is available for your children to borrow.

So please help your children be responsible for caring and returning library books so that everyone can enjoy them.

## **Geraldine Schools Transport Network**

Recently there has been an increase in behaviour issues on the school buses. We ask that you take the time to remind your child/ren of the Code of Conduct (copy on back of this newsletter).

There will be consequences for inappropriate choices on the bus.

For safety reasons:

- Seating plans will remain in place until Thursday 14<sup>th</sup> December.
- Parents are asked not to uplift children from the buses at the High School.
- $\circ~$  Hi Vis vests are to be worn on the bus morning and afternoon.

## **Please Note**

As the High School student numbers are decreasing at this time of the year, the buses will be running earlier from now on. During the week of 11-14<sup>th</sup> December, when there are no High School students, in the mornings the buses will be running approximately 5-10 minutes earlier. Please have your children at the bus stop on time to meet the bus.

# THERE WILL BE NO BUSES RUNNING ON THE AFTERNOON OF THURSDAY 14 DECEMBER

Any new students wanting to catch the bus in 2018, please make sure the completed bus registration form is handed to GPS office before school ends. This will ensure your child is on the bus roll and allocated buses fit the rolls.

## School Bus Code of Conduct

Students agree to abide by the behavioural expectations described below:

- When I am a seated passenger, I will remain in my seat for the whole journey.
- I will not eat on the bus or throw anything inside or out of the bus

- If I am a standing passenger, I will stand quietly and not push or move around the bus
- I will respect other students and their property at all times (this includes pushing, verbal or physical abuse, or any other behaviour that may distract the driver)
- I will use socially acceptable language when conversing with the driver and / or other students and I will not speak at a volume that may distract the driver.
- I will respect the property of the Bus Operator at all times (e.g. refraining from standing on seats or vandalizing the vehicle in any way).
- I will not engage in any behaviour that could put the driver or other students at risk
- I will observe the requirements and instructions of the bus driver, teachers, transport manager for the bus duty at all times
- I understand that any damage I cause to the bus will result in my parent / caregiver being billed for the cost of repairs
- Cellphones are not allowed to be used on any of the Geraldine Schools' Transport Buses unless for an emergency.
- I will wear my Hi Vis vest daily am and pm (Compulsory for GPS students)
- No Scooters, wheels of any kind allowed on the bus.

The safety and comfort of everyone on the bus depends on a standard of behaviour and consideration for others that is expected in the classroom. We hope that parents/caregivers will support the schools in maintaining these standards of behaviour.

## Breaking the Code will result in the following:

- The student will be spoken to by the Transport Manager and depending on the seriousness of the incident(s) parents may be notified immediately, or within a short time if there is no improvement in the behaviour.
- If the behaviour doesn't improve with =in a week, parents will be phoned and may be required to attend an interview at the school.
- •

Failure to reach the required behaviour standard may result in School Bus Transport being withdrawn for that student for a period of time, or permanently.

 In extreme cases of misbehaviour, the privilege of travelling on the school bus may be withdrawn immediately.
