Hot Topic - Family Information Evening

Could your family have a food allergy?

Dr Rodney Ford has been helping families with food allergies and food intolerances for the last 30 years. He was Associate Professor at the Christchurch Paediatric Department and was Director of the Food Allergy Service and he is coming to speak to Ashburton parents on Monday 15th May.

Food allergies are often not easily recognised. He will talk about how food allergies can show up in your children, how to diagnose them, and what to do.

Food allergy causes a wide range of symptoms, which are often put down to a virus or behaviour problems.

He will explore with you:

- Symptoms of food allergy
- Skin tests for allergy
- Eczema and its link to foods
- Coeliac disease and gluten intolerance
- Vomiting and gastric reflux
- Nut allergy
