For our students to be involved in events like the two above, this requires time and input from both staff and parents – training, organising, filling in the required safety forms, transporting and cheering the students on. Thank you and well done to everyone involved!

Most students in Years 1 – 6 will be bringing home a mid year report on Thursday 5 July. These reports will provide parents with an indication of their child's progress towards the achievement expectations of the NZ Curriculum. For some students in Years 1 – 3 this will mean a different reporting timeframe to what was in place during the National Standards era (2010 – 2017). Reporting information for Year 1 -3 students will still be based on their time at school. For Years 4 – 6 there is no change to the reporting cycle. You may be aware that schools are no longer reporting against National Standards, with these being removed by the current government. This transition has been a relatively smooth one, as we still have the NZ Curriculum to use as a measure against student achievement and progress.

Each year in early March schools are required to send the previous year's student achievement data to the Ministry of Education. For 2017, this was National Standards (NS) data. This information will soon be available on the MOE's Education Counts website – www.educationcounts.govt.nz. In short our achievement for 2017 was: Reading - 73% at or above the NS, Writing – 77% and Mathematics 76%. From this we set targets for the following year for gender, year cohorts and key ethnicities as well as individual groups of students that have been identified.

A final reminder to all of our parents is that there is a teachers meeting tomorrow Friday 22nd June. All of our teaching staff will be away attending this meeting on the future of the teaching profession. This means that classes will finish on that day at 12.15pm, with buses departing shortly after. Parents of bus children will need to be at the bus stop to collect their children, or the bus will return them back to school. The buses will depart Geraldine High School at 12.35 pm.

For children who do not get the bus, we encourage parents to collect them at 12.15pm or the children walk home at this time.

Keeping Ourselves Safe 2018 – covered in Weeks 7-10 of Term 2 Each class will be taking part in the Keeping Ourselves Safe Programme this term. Keeping Ourselves Safe helps children develop safety skills when interacting with others. Your child may bring home some follow up homework for this programme. A Police educator will visit the classroom as part of this topic.

Students in Year 1-3 will cover the following modules:

- 1. I am unique- Students will learn their name, address, feelings and who they live with.
- 2. My body is my own- Students will learn body parts and touch that they like, that hurts and that is confusing.
- 3. Dealing with unwanted behaviour and touch- Students will learn about good and bad secrets and saying no to unwanted touch.
- 4. Adults who help- Students will learn about adults they can trust and who can help them.

Students in Year 4-6 will cover the following modules:

- 1. Confident me-Students will develop confidence in their decision-making and feelings.
- 2. Safe or unsafe-Students will learn to identify safe and unsafe situations.
- 3. No excuse for abuse-Students will learn about what abuse is and that it is wrong.
- 4. Why should I tell- Students will learn to stop inappropriate touch and say no.




