From our Principal

Kia ora Whanau. Ka nui te mihi ki a koutou - greetings to you all.

We have had a busy couple of weeks at school with a visiting performer, two teams at the South Canterbury Rippa Tournament, Year 6 kayaking, Pink Shirt Day in recognition of Anti Bullying Week, as well as lots of learning in class!

Tomorrow afternoon from 1.15pm we will hold our annual **cross country** at the Geraldine Domain, which families are most welcome to attend. This year the cross country will be an inter Whanau Group event and we are encouraging students to wear a T-shirt in their Whanau Group colour: Whero – red, Kakariki – green, Kahurangi – blue, Kowhai – yellow if they have one. This can be worn to school in the morning. Please note it is not a full mufti / dress up day. Each participant will get a point for the Whanau Group and those finishing in the top 10 for their age / year will also receive points depending on placings.

I have again included with this newsletter a draft copy of our recently developed **Learner Profile**. This first appeared in the newsletter in Week 2 of this term. The Profile includes a series of statements that capture the knowledge, skills and attributes that students should aim to develop over their time at GPS. We have purposefully set out not to create an exhaustive list of what children need to achieve, thus keeping it manageable. Instead we have taken a broader approach, which covers learning as well as social dispositions.

Many thanks to those families who have paid their **activity fee and voluntary school donation** so far. The activity fee has been set at \$20 and the donation at \$60 per child. If your child has entered GPS during the year, please contact the office regarding the

amount that should be paid. The activity fee is used to cover visiting performers and the donation is spent on curriculum resourcing throughout the school. We certainly appreciate the payments received and budget for these each year. At this stage there has been no further movement on additional Government funding of school donations, so for the time being the status quo will remain.

Education Issues

Throughout New Zealand there is a growing teacher shortage and a crisis in attracting people into the teaching profession; the number of enrolments in initial teacher education dropped markedly in the past five years, while the student population is projected to grow significantly.

To address this, the primary teachers professional body (NZEI – New Zealand Educational Institute) is advocating for more time to teach and lead through more staffing in schools and better pay, alongside greater resourcing for students with complex needs. Parental support is imperative for us to succeed. It's time.

Meetings and negotiations will be happening soon. Our teaching staff will be attending a meeting co-ordinated by the NZEI on Friday 22nd June. For us this will mean that classes will end for the day at 12.15pm, with buses departing shortly after this. Parents of bus children will need to be at the bus stop early on this day to collect their child off the bus. There will be no high school students on the buses at this time so we anticipate the runs being slightly quicker and parents should allow for this. If there is no parent to meet children at the bus stop they will be returned to school by the driver.

For children who do not go home on the bus, we are encouraging parents to collect them at 12.15pm or the children walk / bike home at this time if they would normally do so.

If the early departure is not going to be convenient for parents there will be several staff who will remain at school to supervise children.

Geraldine Primary School Cross Country Friday 25th May

The children have been practicing for our school cross country during school time. They will get to go around the course so they know where to run on the day. Please make sure your child has appropriate footwear during this time.

Our cross country will be held at the Domain, starting at 1.15pm. If postponed then Monday 28th May, this will be on twitter and facebook.

All children take part in this activity unless they have a medical reason for not participating, in which case a letter needs to be written to the Principal or Deputy Principal. We see this activity as being the same as Reading or Maths and that all children should try to do their best.

The race programme will start with the juniors and go through to the senior classes. Junior Syndicate classes are run by age group. Middle and Senior Syndicates are run by year group.

Children may leave after the event is over if their parent is there to take them. Please let the teacher know.

Participation is voluntary and if parents wish their children to take part they should discuss this with them and remind them each Thursday. Mauri ora whanau,



School Donations and Activity Fees

At the end of 2017 the Board of Trustees set the school donation for 2018 at \$60 per student, or \$15 per term. To break this down further - \$1.50 per week. These donations are tax deductible and voluntary and are set as the money we receive from the Ministry of Education generally isn't enough to run the school and meet all expenses. Money received from the donations goes towards the cost of curriculum resources.

There is also a base activity fee of \$20, which pays for visiting performers throughout the year. This is additional to the donation and is non-voluntary.
