From our Principal

Kia ora Whanau. Ka nui te mihi ki a koutou - greetings to you all.

The first term is almost over and children and staff will no doubt be looking forward to the break ahead. We have had a number of events taking place over the term – many thanks to parents and staff who have planned, assisted and attended these activities.

There are many people within our school community who work together to ensure that our children have variety and interest in their learning. A big thank you and well done.

Our Breakfast BBQ last Friday was again very successful and we managed to raise \$1,235.00 – another fantastic effort. This was combined with the Gumboot Day appeal to promote and support wellbeing for our young people. This raised \$455.00.

The Board of Trustees triennial elections will be taking place next term. All parents of Geraldine Primary School will be eligible to vote in this election and this is a good time for parents to consider if they wish to stand for election as a School Trustee. We will be calling for nominations in the first two weeks of next term and nominations close on Friday 24 May. We will keep you informed regarding this process. The last round of Teacher and Principal Union meetings were postponed in light of the tragic events in Christchurch. These meetings have now been rescheduled for early next term. In South Canterbury these will occur on Thursday 9th May to discuss the most recent offer from the Ministry of Education. Most of the teachers at Geraldine Primary School will be attending an early afternoon meeting, thus enabling the school to remain open for the day.

The organisation for this day will be the same as what it would have been last time and is as follows:

Normal classes will operate until 12.15pm. There will be 3-4 teachers remaining at school in the afternoon until the end of the school day, along with some teacher aides. Normal classroom programmes will stop at 12.15pm, with an alternative programme in place after the lunch break. At 12.15pm, parents are welcome to collect their children from school if they don't want them to remain for the afternoon's alternative programme. This programme will occur with the above reduced staffing. Buses will still depart at the normal time of 2.45pm.

Earlier this week the upgrade of Rooms 1 and 2 was completed. This has seen new carpet, wall coverings and paint in the classes which gives them a much needed freshen up ready for the start of term 2. Planning for the upgrade of Room 10 and a new build for Room 13 is well underway and we anticipate that this will commence next term.

South Canterbury Rural Support to host Lance Burdett - resilience coach and crisis negotiator

During his 22 years as a police officer, Lance Burdett was heavily involved as a crisis negotiator for over 13 years and was the National Advisor for the NZ Police Negotiation Teams. Qualifying as a crisis negotiator in three international jurisdictions including the FBI, he ran numerous high-risk negotiations including the Napier Siege and the highly-publicised Paremoremo prison hostage situation. Lance was recently interviewed by TV 1 and the "Sunday" programme during the aftermath of the recent Christchurch shootings because he has the expertise in responding to emergencies and communicating in challenging situations.

In 1999, Lance had depression caused by burnout. After studying the causes, he now provides presentations and workshops on how to overcome the pressure and stress that a modern world brings to our slow-developing brain. In his presentations, Lance provides practical, simple, and intuitive techniques on how to get to sleep quickly and stay asleep, how to significantly reduce worry, how to bring balance to your life with a small change, and ways to overcome the numerous challenges we face on a daily basis. He uses humorous anecdotes to describe how our brains tend to see only negative things and then exaggerate them to leave us feeling overwhelmed. More importantly, he brings a solution to 'retrain' our brain.

Lance's speciality was, and still is, suicide intervention and prevention and in predicting violent behaviour. Along with the skills he learned through this first-hand experience, Lance has a Master of Arts Degree, majoring in Terrorism, Safety and Security. He has a Graduate Diploma in Business Studies, a Diploma in Policing and a Graduate Certificate in Applied Management.

He has a track record of leading successful teams through recruitment, training, professional development, motivation and welfare support. His clients include government departments and businesses and he has started working with the Rural Support Trust to help rural people deal with stress.

Lance is a fascinating and entertaining presenter with a wealth of knowledge and expertise in the field of personal resilience who will leave you inspired and motivated.
