#### From our Principal

Kia ora Whanau. Ka nui te mihi ki a koutou - greetings to you all.

We are now over half way through what has been a very busy and fast-paced term so far. There have been a number of events that students have been involved in, alongside classroom programmes, and I acknowledge the support that parents and whanau have provided for these.

In last week's flyer I discussed the **union meetings for teachers and principals** that are occurring next week. Negotiations around primary school teacher and principal employment agreements with the Ministry of Education are ongoing. These negotiations have been taking place over a number of months, with no settlement yet in place. There will be a meeting for all primary teachers in South Canterbury to discuss the most recent offer from the MOE during school time on Thursday 21 March. Most of the teachers at GPS will be attending an early afternoon meeting, thus enabling the school to remain open for the full day.

#### How this will work for us is as follows:

Normal classes will operate until 12.15pm. There will be 3 - 4 teachers remaining at school in the afternoon until the end of the school day, along with some teacher aides. Normal classroom programmes will stop at 12.15pm, with an alternative programme in place after the lunch break. At 12.15pm, parents are welcome to collect their children from school if they don't want them to remain at school for the afternoon's alternative programme, which will occur with the above reduced staffing. Buses will still depart at the normal time of 2.45pm.

Should you wish to collect your child at 12.15pm on 21 March, please wait outside their classroom at this time. This organisation enables teachers to attend the meeting and minimise disruption for families.

In March each year schools are required to submit their **Charter and Strategic Plan** to the Ministry of Education, along with analysis of **student achievement**. The Charter and Strategic Plan are available for viewing in the school office. Broadly speaking, our 2018

student achievement data indicated that 79% of our students achieved at or above the curriculum expectation in reading and writing, along with 72% in mathematics. Each year as a school we always look for ways to raise achievement, both at a school-wide level and at an individual class or syndicate level. This could be through existing learner support programmes, professional discussions and development or by introducing new programmes.

Geraldine Primary School is part of our local CoL (**Community of Learning**). The name of the CoL is Ka Awa Whiria or 'braided river,' which connects to our unique locality nearby our own braided river, the Rangitata. It also alludes to the purpose of a Community of Learning - a group of education providers that form around children and young people's learning pathways, and work together to help them achieve their full potential.

Along with Geraldine Primary School, Ka Awa Whiria Community of Learning is made up of our five early childhood centres: Clandeboye Preschool, Geraldine Kindergarten, Geraldine Preschool, Haywood Montessori Nursery School, Peel Forest Preschool, three other primary schools: Carew Peel Forest School, Winchester Rural School, Woodbury School, Geraldine High School and Ara Institute of Canterbury.

To strengthen our collaboration between schools we have staff who have the responsibility of a 'Within School Teacher' for our CoL. These teachers are focusing on the wellbeing of all students, and transitioning between schools. At Geraldine Primary School we have two Within School Teachers: wellbeing – Sarah Strowger, and transition – Andrea Bathgate.

I have been the Lead Principal of the CoL since the start of term 2, 2018 and Jason Shaw (Geraldine High School) works alongside me as the 'Across Schools Teacher' working with each partner in CoL.

Along with these appointments at the end of last year, we were also successful in gaining funding for professional development that will explore how oral language can assist student achievement. Over the next 18 months we will be working with Ms Del Costello, an oral language specialist. Along with her work with teachers in each school, we look forward to giving parents and the community the opportunity to hear her share some of her ideas later this year.

We look forward to seeing how this closer connection between all education providers in the area strengthens the learning experience for children and young people over the coming years. Next week we will be visited by reviewers from the Education Review Office (ERO). ERO visit all education providers in New Zealand on a cyclical basis. Our last external review was in Term 4, 2015 and much has been developed and strengthened at GPS over this time, due to the hard work of our staff, Board of Trustees, Home and School group, parents and students. We look forward to welcoming the review team to school and working alongside them over the week. Their findings are typically made public six – eight weeks after the review team has been on site.

I would like to acknowledge several members of the Home and School who have recently stepped aside from their roles on the committee – Helen England (President), Jane Harmon (Secretary) and Paula Campbell (Treasurer) have all been on the Home and School for many years and have led the committee admirably. On behalf of the

staff, Board and members of the GPS community, I thank them for their tireless efforts. We welcome existing members Lou Ochsner (President), Angela Milne (Treasurer) and Jolie Mockford (Secretary) into these roles. Helen, Jane and Paula will remain on the committee.

Lastly, a reminder that voluntary school donations (\$60 per child per year) and activity fees (\$20 per child per year) are now due. The donations contribute to the cost of providing curriculum resources and the activity fees cover the cost of the various performers that we have at school throughout the year. If you haven't paid these already, please make arrangements to do so soon. Regular automatic payments can be set up to spread the cost over the year. The donation can also be claimed back through tax returns. Please note that additional activity costs, e.g. camps and class trips are over and above these two items and are payable accordingly.
