From the Principal...

Kia ora Whanau. Ka nui te mihi ki a koutou - greetings to you all.

Last Friday saw the completion of our Room 10 / 13 rebuild. Construction started on this project in June and the planning stages date back to 2018. To have it finish on time was a major achievement and it is testament to the positive working relationship between the school, Board of Trustees, School Support (Project Managers), Henderson Construction and Rushton Architects that has been apparent throughout the project. There were some very excited Year 4 students on Friday afternoon as they moved into their new rooms. Room 10 moved back into their remodelled classroom, while Room 17 have now vacated the classroom at the back to the hall to fill the adjacent new room. Year 3 classes in Rooms 11 and 12 will no doubt be looking forward to a less interrupted (noisy!) learning environment as well. In 2020 there will be some room number realignment, which we will let you know about before the end of the term.

There has been more sponsorship coming in of late for this development and we are most appreciative for this. The Board of Trustees continues to seek business, family or individual sponsorship of any value for this project, as part of it is owned by the Board. On the first school day of 2020 (Monday 3 February) we will be holding an official opening of the new block, to which our school community and our sponsors will be invited. In the meantime, please feel free to pop in and have a look at the new rooms!

On recent GPS Facebook posts we have made mention of some exciting happenings and achievements, one of which was the WAVE Challenge Day, which was led by our WAVE and Whanau Group leaders. This is always an event that students look forward to in our annual calendar. Senior students Elizabeth G, Aria, Jackson and Ollie represented GPS at a memorial service for Mr Prosser, who used to read to senior classes. Mr Prosser was a wonderful gentleman who inspired our students with his reading and expression. Our students read extracts from some of Mr Prosser's stories. Year 6 students Jess and Tahlea have really achieved in tennis at a regional level recently. Tahlea represented GPS at a lower South Island primary schools tournament, coming first. She and Jess also

combined in the South Canterbury team to come second. Our Green Team has been active around the school with the upcycling of old tyres into a colourful feature of flower gardens. Their creativity really came through on this project - well done!

We have recently received the resignation of Ange Dudson-Moko, who has been teaching at GPS in the senior school for the past five years. This year she has been furthering her qualifications in Te Reo through the University of Canterbury. We wish her for future opportunities and recognise the contributions she has made to our school community in her time at GPS.

Further to this, we have appointed Hannah Beynon to a Year 6 position for 2020. Hannah has taught for several years at Glenavy School before embarking on a teaching experience in Tanzania and overseas travel. We look forward to welcoming her to GPS.

In a month's time, the school year will have ended. We are in a particularly busy time of the year, especially for the staff who are completing reports and other end of year requirements. Some children are showing signs of tiredness and I ask families to carefully consider bedtimes at this time to ensure children get a good night's sleep and can be as focused in class as possible. For our Year 6s, in a month's time they will have completed their primary education and will be moving onto high school. It is important that they finish strongly and on a positive note, both individually and collectively.

# School Activity Fees and Donations

A gentle reminder about payment of school donations and activity fees for the year, if you have not done so already. An issue that schools face is the difference between the running costs of the school and what we receive in funding from the

Ministry of Education. We ask for a donation of \$15 per term / \$60 for the year per child. Part of this amount can be claimed back through tax returns. Alongside the donation we charge a \$5.00 Activity Fee per child per term / \$20 per year. This will pay for visiting performers that have been booked throughout the year. ### Desire to Learn, Aspire to Achieve Whaia e koe te iti Kahurangi

The Geraldine Primary School Board of Trustees is raising funds to build a new Board-owned classroom at Geraldine Primary, replacing the existing Room 13. Because the classroom will be owned by the Board, Ministry of Education funding cannot be used for this project, and we need to raise approximately \$150,000 to supplement the funding we have put aside from our own reserves for the project.

Having an extra classroom allows the Board to keep class sizes smaller than the Ministry provision, ensuring Geraldine Primary School is able to provide students with quality educational opportunities in a fit for purpose environment. A high standard of schooling in Geraldine is vital to the town's potential to attract young families to the district, ensuring its continued growth and development for the benefit of all.

This new classroom would enable the school to suspend the use of the room at the rear of the school hall as a classroom, freeing up the space for additional opportunities such as music lessons from itinerant teachers, or targeted sessions for groups of students. It would also make it easier for a wider range of groups to access and use the school hall at all times of the day, without concerns around disturbing children's learning or the security of property.

The new classroom will be built in conjunction with a Ministry-funded upgrade to Room 10 in 2019. We are seeking donations now from the school whanau, local businesses and wider community, and hope your business will consider being part of this important new chapter in Geraldine Primary School's history.
