From our Principal

Kia ora Whanau. Ka nui te mihi ki a koutou - greetings to you all

We have all been shocked and saddened by the events that occurred in Christchurch on Friday 15 March. This will affect people, including our children in different ways. For parents it can be hard to know how to approach such events with your child and dealing with this is largely relevant to the age of the child. Parents and teachers can support feelings of security and safety by maintaining routines for children's daily activities and talking about their own feelings and positive coping strategies that they have learnt to use.

It has reminded us that everyday is special and to be treasured and also of the need to show empathy and compassion towards others.

Last Friday we joined with the rest of the country to observe two minutes silence to honour those who lost their lives. We will be making a donation from our Breakfast BBQ (5 April) to the fund that has been set up to support the Muslim community.

The above event saw Christchurch and surrounding schools enter a lockdown, where children and staff were locked inside buildings until they were given the all clear to depart. In certain situations it may be necessary to keep all students inside. These situations include severe storms, a major accident in the school vicinity, or other dangerous situation.

As appropriate to the situation, the school informs parents and caregivers when it can, using the available communication options, e.g. Facebook / Skool Loop app. Parents are required to follow instructions issued by the school, including not coming to the school to see or collect their children. While this may be difficult, this is particularly important when the school is in lockdown under Police instruction.

Last Saturday the Middle Syndicate held a Book Fair in the school hall. This was part of a financial literacy unit and monies raised will assist with the development of a new

classroom where the old Room 13 stood. I congratulate all those involved and thank them for their efforts. I think the students had a lot of fun helping their teachers set up for the fair on Friday! Thank you also to Ollie Barnett who generously donated a new bike to be first prize in a raffle, along with Barkers and Grandpa's Toys who also provided prizes.

In terms 2 and 3 a local church group offers an optional Bible in Schools programme at GPS. This takes place over one lunchtime a week. If you wish your child to take part, please phone (6938208) or email the school office (office@geraldine.school.nz) by the end of term. Please note that you need to opt your child into this group if you wish them to take part by contacting the office. Students won't be able to attend without a parental consent.

It is likely that the programme will be shortened this year due to the availability of suitable space around the rebuild of Room 10. This will start at a date to be confirmed in term 2 and will see Room 10 move to the library through terms 2 and 3 and into term 4. Completion of Room 10 and the new Room 13 will be before the end of term 4, all going well.

Kia kaha, kia toa, kia manawanui – be strong, be bold, be steadfast.
