From the Principal...

Kia ora Whanau. Ka nui te mihi ki a koutou - greetings to you all.

In two weeks time we will be having our school athletics day. This year due to increased numbers the athletics day will be run for Geraldine Primary School students with Woodbury and Carew hosting their own athletics. Classes have been busy preparing for athletics and will be looking forward to the day I'm sure. Parents and whanau are most welcome to attend this day and bring a picnic lunch to share with their children. Further details will be sent home closer to the time.

On the 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> of November Alpine Energy will be doing a lines upgrade in Geraldine. This will see Wilson Street closed to traffic and pedestrians on these two days. If you drop children off through the Wilson Street entrances, please use either Huffey or Cox Streets. Buses will arrive and depart from Cox Street, north of the crossing. Power to the school will still be supplied and it will be business as usual at school.

Congratulations to Sarah Dunckley and Claire Lovelock who have been appointed to a position in the Junior Syndicate for next year, they currently work together in Room 15. We look forward to having them continue on the staff at Geraldine Primary.

We are beginning the process of forming classes for 2019. # School Activity Fees and Donations

A gentle reminder about payment of school donations and activity fees for the year, if you have not done so already. An issue that schools face is the difference between the running costs of the school and what we receive in funding from the Ministry of Education. We ask for a donation of \$15 per term / \$60 for the year per child. Part of this amount can be claimed back through tax returns. Alongside the donation we charge a \$5.00 Activity Fee per child per term / \$20 per year. This will pay for visiting performers that have been booked throughout the year.

Support staff are making a difference for children. Now it's time to make a difference for support staff!

New Zealand's school funding system is broken.

It fails to deliver certainty for schools, secure and fairly paid work for support staff, and consistent, quality learning support for students.

Teacher aides are on the frontline of learning support. They are often unable to support themselves and their families on what they earn. 90% of teacher aides are earning less than the living wage and most are in insecure, fixed-term employment.

The system is broken, but together we can change it.

WHATAREWECAMPAIGNING FOR?

Pay equity and collective agreement negotiations for teacher aides are underway, and we're pushing for a government commitment to a substantial pay increase that finally recognises teacher aides' skills and responsibilities by the end of 2019.

Other support staff also need significant pay increases, improvements to allowances and firm commitments to pay equity processes too.

Government funding is essential to make this happen. Schools must be resourced to pay support staff fairly, ensure secure employment and provide high quality learning support.

Support staff make a real difference for our tamariki and rangatahi – and now it's time for the people on the frontline of education to get a fair go. Together, we can make it happen.

### Desire to Learn, Aspire to Achieve Whaia e koe te iti Kahurangi

The Geraldine Primary School Board of Trustees is raising funds to build a new Board-owned classroom at Geraldine Primary, replacing the existing Room 13. Because the classroom will be owned by the Board, Ministry of Education funding cannot be used for this project, and we need to raise approximately \$150,000 to supplement the funding we have put aside from our own reserves for the project.

Having an extra classroom allows the Board to keep class sizes smaller than the Ministry provision, ensuring Geraldine Primary School is able to provide students with quality educational opportunities in a fit for purpose environment. A high standard of schooling in Geraldine is vital to the town's potential to attract young families to the district, ensuring its continued growth and development for the benefit of all.

This new classroom would enable the school to suspend the use of the room at the rear of the school hall as a classroom, freeing up the space for additional opportunities such as music lessons from itinerant teachers, or targeted sessions for groups of students. It would also make it easier for a wider range of groups to access and use the school hall at all times of the day, without concerns around disturbing children's learning or the security of property.

The new classroom will be built in conjunction with a Ministry-funded upgrade to Room 10 in 2019. We are seeking donations now from the school whanau, local businesses and wider community, and hope your business will consider being part of this important new chapter in Geraldine Primary School's history.
