From the Principal...

Kia ora Whanau. Ka nui te mihi ki a koutou - greetings to you all.

The start of summer definitely means that we are into the last couple of weeks of the school year and what a year it has been! As we head into the festive season, I feel that it is important to take time to reflect on the challenges and successes that 2020 has brought and how far we have come as a school. We've coped remarkably well with the challenges of Covid-19 and the associated distance learning that schools were tasked with at short notice. This seems a long time ago now, but it is still a defining factor for us all. Being in New Zealand and in South Canterbury we possibly have fared better than other places around New Zealand and definitely better than other countries in this regard.

For us as a school, 2020 has been a year of progress, in the ongoing development of our school and the way we work together to make GPS the best we can be, to achieve our school vision of Desire to Learn, Aspire to Achieve. This can take on many forms - collectively as a school, for individuals who make progress in their learning, or for groups of students that do well in a particular area. This can only be achieved with the support of parents and whanau, together with our staff team. Well done everyone!

I'd like to congratulate our departing Year 6 students for what they have achieved this year. I've had the privilege of starting at GPS at a similar time to many of these students and it has been great to see how they have progressed and developed into the people that they are today. Again, it's been a team effort. Seeing their recent efforts with the Breakfast BBQ showed what can be achieved when there is cooperation and teamwork. They will soon walk across the stage at our Leavers' Assembly for the last time as GPS students. I hope that they take time to reflect on their journey at GPS and take strength from what they have achieved.

I'd like to acknowledge the many students who competed in the recent South Canterbury Schools Athletics and Swimming events. We received a high number of placings at these events. New records were set by the U9 boys 4 x 100m relay (athletics) and 9 year old 4 x 25m relay (swimming), the latter of whom beat the previous record set by GPS in 2016 by 4 seconds! Isaac B-L, Ethan W, Grace W, Addison C were in the record-breaking swim relay team and Hamish G, Luca K, Flynn S and Sam O'C were in the athletics relay team that set a new record. Full results from these two South Canterbury events have been listed later in the newsletter, along with age group champions from our school athletic sports. Congratulations to everyone involved. It was somewhat of a relief to get our athletics in last Wednesday, with a couple of rotations occurring in the rain before we abandoned the last section!

We have two staff members leaving GPS at the end of this year. Debbie Scott, our Learning Support Coordinator, is departing after 17 years of service at GPS. 14 of these have been in her current role. She has worked tirelessly with students who require additional support, alongside their families. I have recently had the honour of speaking about Debbie at our end of year staff dinner and a South Canterbury teachers' function. Words like service, dedication, fairness, passion, wisdom and professionalism were used to describe Debbie and what she has achieved at GPS. On behalf of the GPS community, I wish Debbie all the best for her next chapter in teaching, wherever that may take her.

Anita Johnston, who has been part of our Teacher Aide team, has won a position at Waihi School, which will cover learning support, wellbeing and pastoral care roles. I know she will enjoy this new challenge. I thank Anita for the work that she has done with our learning support programmes over the past two years and wish her well for her future endeavours.

I'd also like to acknowledge Sara Jamieson, Katya Caird and Amy Wynn. Sara stepped into Room 13 after the Covid lockdown and has worked with the class since then Monday - Thursday. Katya and Amy have taught in Room 3 since last term while Chelley Leov has been having treatment. Thank you to these three teachers for providing the consistency that these classes needed and the support that they have given to GPS. I'm sure we will be seeing them back in some capacity in 2021!

We are hoping to commence our next classroom upgrade project in the holidays, or early in Term 1, 2021. This project will cover Room 3 and the surrounding work spaces.

Your child's report will come home on Thursday 10 December. A note will accompany the report, which will outline what room your child will be in for 2021, along with school-wide class organisation. Considerable time is spent drafting and finalising class lists and we consider a variety of factors when determining the composition of each class.

Also on 10 December we will have our Principal's Assembly where we acknowledge students who have been in leadership roles over the past year. Parents and whanau are most welcome to attend this assembly.
