Classes for 2022

We have started the process of forming classes for 2022. If you have a 5 year old New Entrant child who will start with us next, year, or know of someone who this applies to, it is important that the office is informed as soon as possible and an enrolment form completed, if this hasn't been done already. This also applies to children in other year groups who will be attending GPS from 2021. Having an accurate understanding about new enrolments is important as it assists within the composition of classes.

Early departure from school

Parents or other family members will on occasions, need to collect their child(ren) from school for legitimate reasons during the school day. We ask that parents / whānau phone the office prior with a time they expect to be at school. We can then arrange for the child(ren) to be at the office waiting. Parents / whānau then collect their child(ren) from the office. We also ask that parents / whānau sign a brief register to say that they have collected their child(ren) from school. This is so that we have a clear understanding of which children are on site (done through twice daily registers) and who has left the grounds.
