From the Principal...

Kia ora Whanau.

Ka nui te mihi ki a koutou - greetings to you all.

This time last week I had the opportunity to join the Year 5 and 6 classes at Roundhill for a day of skiing. The weather forecast leading up to the day was marginal to say the least, but the day we experienced at Roundhill was amazing! It was a privilege to see our senior children thrive in the mountain environment, push through the challenges they encountered and have a wonderful time together. Many thanks to parents who attended the day to either ski with groups of children or who were stationed on the learner



slopes to pick them up when they fell over!



This term we are reviewing Behaviour Management and Concerns / Complaints policies. To read and review a policy doesn't take long and you are asked to rate the content and implementation of each policy.

I have sent out a survey link through class teachers to forward onto parents about digital device usage. GPS, along with other schools and early childhood centres in the wider Geraldine area are all part of a Community of Learning or Kahui Ako. Together we are gathering information from parents across the district about how devices are used by children and young people and for what purposes. The data gathered across the Kahui Ako will assist us in better understanding and addressing the needs of families in our area. Each year some of our Year 4 - 6 students have the opportunity to attend the Woodbury School Pet Day, at the Woodbury Domain. This year, due to the uncertainty of Covid alert levels and subsequent limitations on numbers, we are not able to attend this event.

Another uncertainty that has arisen from Covid is our end of term celebration assembly. If we should move to Level 1 in the middle of next week, we will need to see what form this assembly will take. The host syndicate typically spends quite a bit of time together in preparation for the assembly and at Level 2 this is unable to occur. We will keep you posted with further details.
