From the Principal...

Kia ora Whanau.

Ka nui te mihi ki a koutou - greetings to you all.

Welcome back to the start of Term 3 everyone! I hope that you've all had a safe, enjoyable and relaxing break. It was wonderful to see all the students back earlier this week, ready for the term ahead.

Our Celebration Assembly on the last day of term 2 was a real highlight and a great spectacle of our Tāne Mahuta tamariki and the work they have been doing across the term. A big congratulations to them and the staff in the junior school for all the work they put into the preparation for the assembly. It was great to see so many parents and whanau at the assembly, whose support we are always appreciative of.

In week 8 of this term we will be having our performance week. This year's theme is a Celebration of our Cultures - He waka eke noa. This will be an opportunity to recognise and celebrate our cultural diversity at GPS. We are planning to have a matinee performance on Tuesday 14 September at 10am, an evening performance that night and another evening performance on Wednesday 15th. This promises to be an exciting occasion for the students, staff and our whanau. Planning for this is well underway and we are looking forward to sharing the finished product with our school community later in the term.

This week we have been treated to visits from two special groups. On Wednesday we had the Royal NZ Navy band performing and they certainly kept us entertained with their music and dancing. This morning we had a visit from players and other staff from the NZ Warriors league team. This was another experience with a high level of engagement and enthusiasm from the students. They spoke about the importance of nutrition, hydration and sleep, along with some league-related quiz questions.

From time to time parents or other family members will need to collect their child(ren) from school for legitimate reasons during the school day. We ask that parents / whanau phone the office prior with a time they expect to be at school. We can then arrange for the child(ren) to be at the office waiting. Parents / whanau then collect their child(ren) from the office. We also ask that parents / whanau sign a brief register to say that they have collected their child(ren) from school. This is so that we have a clear understanding of which children are on site (done through twice daily registers) and who has left the school grounds

Our Year 6 students will be visiting Geraldine High School next Thursday morning (5 August) for an orientation visit and we wish them well as they prepare for their transition to high school.

Bookings can now be made online for 3 Way Conferences, which will take place on Thursday 19th August from 3.00-6.00 pm and Friday 20th August from 12.45-5.45 pm. As teachers will be involved in 3WCs all afternoon on Friday 20th August classes will stop at 12.15pm.

Non bus students will be sent home at this time, please ensure you either collect your child from school or are at home to receive them. If your child goes on a bus they will leave GPS at 12.15pm and the High School at 12.30pm. Please make sure someone is at the bus stop to meet children as the buses will arrive early because there will be no High School students on board.

# **WAVES**A Bereaved by Suicide Group

This grief education programme is for adults 18+ who have been affected by the suicide of someone they know.

The group allows members to

- share their thoughts and feelings around what's happened
- discuss the nature of suicide
- gain information and ideas about how to care for themselves and others, including children and young people, after a suicide

The group of 6—8 people is facilitated by professional counsellors and educators and runs over 8 weeks. The date may need to be changed if there is an insufficient number of participants registered for the group.
