From the Principal...

Kia ora Whanau. Ka nui te mihi ki a koutou - greetings to you all.

The last week has given us another reminder about how vulnerable we are to the forces of Mother Nature as our area was again hit with flooding. Our thoughts go out to families from our school or wider community whose homes and property were affected by the floods. While the river levels are returning to normal, the clean-up continues for these families and the build-up of debris is still very noticeable around bridges and river beds.

If any school families are finding the current situation difficult, please feel free to get in touch with either myself or our school Social Worker - Deana Averill.

I'd like to raise the issue of student safety on the roads around town. From time to time we get reports from parents or members of the community about some of our students not thinking when they cross the road on the way to or from school. This could include crossing without looking, or riding a bicycle inappropriately. I have spoken with the students at a recent assembly about this, noting that it takes considerable time and distance for a driver to react and slow down if a child crosses the road without thought for themselves or drivers, as well as the inevitable consequences of this happening. It will be appreciated if this message could be reinforced at home with your child (ren) too.

With school being closed for two days last week, our cross country was postponed and then the Domain grounds were too wet for our back up day last Wednesday. As the South Canterbury Cross Country is next Friday and names having to be decided very soon, staff will be determining who will represent GPS at this event from the efforts demonstrated at practices and will announce names from there. Please note the South Canterbury event is for students in Year 5 and 6.

The School Board is two years into their three year election cycle. While the next Board elections are not until May/June 2022, succession planning is being considered by the Board. Being on a School Board is a wonderful way to contribute to your child's school at a governance level. Boards are made up of parents or community members, as well as the principal and staff elected representative. If anyone would like to know more about being on a School Board, you are most welcome to attend a meeting. Our next one is on 30 June at 6pm in the staffroom. OCEANS Grief and Loss is a peer support programme for children, teens, and adults who have experienced loss in their life. The losses we work with usually come from the death of a significant person, or a personal experience of separation/divorce. The focus of this programme is providing a safe environment for participants to talk about their loss/es and the change/s that have occurred then look ahead to a preferred future living and coping with the loss/change. We meet once a week for eight weeks in the children's programme and six weeks for the teen and adult's programme. We have seen many people go through the programme and have numerous success stories of how it has helped (Over 500 since Oceans started in 2006).
