From the Principal...

Kia ora Whānau,

Ka nui te mihi ki a koutou - greetings to you all.

The end of the school year is now just under two weeks away. The end of Term 4 always seems to come in a bit of a rush, with a lot of events taking place, as well as end of year deadlines to meet. Please refer to the calendar later in this newsletter for the key dates over the next two weeks.

Many thanks to everyone who came to our recent Open Morning. It was great to see parents and family members sitting in with their children to see learning in action across the school. The staff and I certainly appreciated support that this received and the positive comments from parents. Over time. approaches to teaching and learning do evolve as well as



being somewhat cyclical and our staff do a wonderful job of keeping current,

knowing what works, but also being open to adapting practices to suit the needs of our ākonga (learners). It was rewarding to showcase the wonderful work that our staff and tamariki are doing in classrooms at Geraldine Primary.

Last Tuesday we had a group of 16 Year 5 and 6 students who represented GPS at the South Canterbury Schools Relay. Both teams competed very well, with the boys team coming first in their section. Congratulations to you all!









Student reports are currently being worked on and edited at present. These will come home on Thursday 8 December. These reports will inform parents about key aspects of achievement for their child(ren) and where they are in relation to NZ Curriculum expectations, as well as our school values and attendance levels. On Friday 9 December, students will visit their teacher for 2023 and spend part of the morning with them. This year's teacher will inform them what class they will visit that day and will be in for 2023. A note will come home on Friday with your child confirming 2023 classes.

We are currently seeing growing numbers of Covid cases, particularly amongst our students. A reminder that if your child is displaying Covid-like symptoms, they need to test and if positive, isolate for the normal for the seven-day period, returning to school on Day 8. The first day of symptoms is still Day 0. Family members need to test each morning for the first five days and if they test negative, students can come to school.

Over the holidays, Rooms 12 and 13 will receive an upgrade, and this work will most likely go into March next year. The scope of the work includes wall linings, whiteboard storage units, painting, and in Room 13, some new carpet. The exterior of the hall will also be painted over the break.

Our Breakfast BBQ this morning went ahead despite the rain, which, at 8am, didn't look too bad at all! Many thanks to our school whānau who were able to attend. It's also rewarding to see some of our ex students call in before school too. A big well done to our amazing Year 6 tamariki and their teachers for the work they put into their stalls. Many thanks to our Home and School group for their support, thank you to everyone who made yummy baking and thank you to the Geraldine Lions who cooked the sausages for us. It was a real GPS team effort and the money raised goes towards supporting our sponsored child, Mohosina in Bangladesh. Some of the leftover baking will be sold at the Farmers' Market this weekend.





We have two staff leaving GPS at the end of this year. Diana Corden will be taking up a new role as a RTLB (Resource Teacher of Learning and Behaviour), working across and supporting schools in South Canterbury. Diana has been with us for the past 18 months teaching in senior classes and we have all benefited from her involvement and dedication to our school.

Pauline Ramsay has been working at GPS in various full and part time capacities over the past 20 years. More recently, in 2021, she stepped into a full time role at short notice for a large part of the year and has been a regular part of Rooms 7 and 8. Many current and past students will remember Mrs Ramsay and her guitar and her genuine care for the many students who have been in her classes. Pauline has indicated that she will still be available for some relieving work in 2023, so we will no doubt see her around school next year.

Finally, I wish our Jump Jam crew all the best for their performance at the Christmas Parade this evening. Hopefully the weather stays relatively fine for them and the other participants!
