From the Principal...

Kia ora Whānau.

Ka nui te mihi ki a koutou - greetings to you all.

Many thanks to parents and students who were able to attend our 3 Way Conferences over the past two days. I understand that a number of our families are currently in isolation and were therefore unable to attend. If you wish to make contact with your child's teacher when you are able to, please do so. The Zoom 3WC option proved to be popular for some of our families too. The impact of Covid over the past two plus years has brought Zoom and Google Meets into our practice a lot more and it's something that I've become more used to and confident in using.

We continue to have gradual increases in our Covid case and household contact numbers, with most of our students who were affected earlier on now back at school. The Covids even managed to reach me early last week, which put the Levertons in isolation and an additional family member contracting it. It is good to be back at school, seeing everyone again!

I'd like to acknowledge the work that the staff are doing to keep learning programmes continuing at school and also by providing home learning for those who have been away from school. Also, we are grateful to our parents and school whānau who continue to follow key protocols around pick up / drop off, contacting school regarding family isolation and wearing of masks inside the school grounds. Mask wearing still applies to parents / whānau on school grounds unless they have a genuine exemption.

There have been recent further announcements from Government around Covid protocols. Once we receive more detailed information from the Ministry of Education and how these announcements impact on schools, we will share this with you. I have included some information about isolation further in the newsletter, including changes to the re-isolation period.



The prevalence of Covid has heightened the importance of our own wellbeing and that of those around us. www.allright.org.nz is one website that has some useful ideas for families / parents to use. One neat idea is about having G.L.A.D korero (conversations) with your whānau about your day one thing you are **Gr**ateful for? Did you Learn something new? What did you Accomplish? What brought you **D**elight today? Thinking about what we're grateful for magnifies positive feelings and helps to reduce negative ones.

The Home and School group have their AGM on Monday 11 April, 7pm in the staffroom. All new and existing members are most welcome to attend and learn more about what the group does to support the school and our tamariki.

Covid Protocols

- If someone becomes a confirmed COVID-19 case, then that case and all other people in their household must isolate for seven days.
- If **someone else** in the household then tests positive for COVID-19 during those seven days:
 - the isolation period for that person only re-sets that person must isolate for an additional seven days from the day they test positive or symptoms begin
 - o other household contacts who do not test positive are still able to leave isolation after the original case has completed their seven days isolation.
- For the **next 10 days** after a household completes seven days isolation, evidence shows that due to their exposure to COVID-19 they are less likely to catch or transmit the virus. This means:
 - o if someone else in the household tests positive within those 10 days, the whole household will not have to re-isolate, only the positive case
 - o if someone else in the household tests positive and it has been **more than 10 days** since the household completed isolation, household contacts **should re-isolate** along with the new case for seven days.
- Any person who has had COVID-19 within the last 90 days/three months will not need to isolate as a household contact unless they become symptomatic and test positive again. This is because reinfection rates for people who have had COVID-19 are low for the three months after they have the virus.

Remember, Day 0 for isolation is the day symptoms began or the day the positive test was taken (whichever came first). You should then count your seven days from there.
