From the Principal...

Kia ora Whānau.

Ka nui te mihi ki a koutou - greetings to you all.

Welcome back to the start of Term 2! I hope all our school whānau have had a refreshing break. It was great to see the students again on Monday, ready for the term ahead. The staff and I are excited for the next nine weeks of Term 2, as we look forward to learning experiences and various events across the term.

In early April the Home and School committee assisted at the Beautiful Valley Trail Bike Ride. This is a longstanding and extremely worthwhile fundraiser for the Home and School and it was again a very successful event for the riders, organisers and GPS. Many thanks to everyone who helped out on the day and leading up to it. Special thanks to the landowners who allow us to use their farms / forest each year and also our local sponsors. Our policy review topics for this term are around the broad topics of Healthcare and Behaviour Management. Our policies can be accessed through the School Docs portal - https://gps.schooldocs.co.nz. Click on Current Review, read over the review instructions and then click in the review links for the individual policies. The review will be open all term. There is also a supplementary review of the Bible in Schools programme, which closes on Monday. Details have been emailed to all parents earlier this week.

Parents will have received an email on Wednesday about the Relationships and Sexuality Education programmes that will be starting to be taught at school soon. This is part of the NZ Curriculum, specifically the Health and Physical Education Curriculum. There can be a lot of misunderstanding about what is taught in this programme. Topics taught will be appropriate to a

child's age and we have provided parents with an overview of the themes covered in the email sent, which will provide more detail. It is anticipated that all tamariki will be part of the programme in their class, but if there is a specific theme that you do not wish your child to participate in, please let me know what aspect this is by email before 8:30am on Monday 9 May.

Finally, there are several ways you can get in touch with staff in the school and email is one of these ways. Please be aware that teachers are not able to respond to emails whilst they are teaching, but will be able to do so after school, or the next day. If an email is sent in the evening, this may not be able to be replied to until the following day, or after the weekend if sent on a Friday. In the office, staff will clear emails periodically during the day, alongside other requirements of their role. The end of the school day is normally a busy time in the office, so any email sent at this time may not be cleared until after school, or the next day. A phone call at this time of the day is generally better if you need to get a more timely message to your child. Thank you for your support in this matter.
